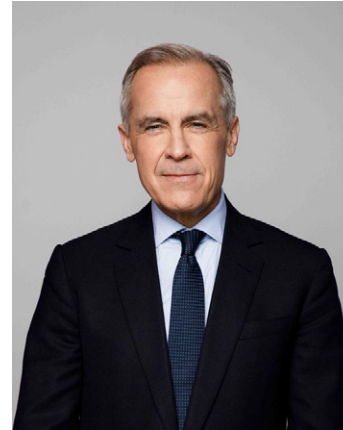

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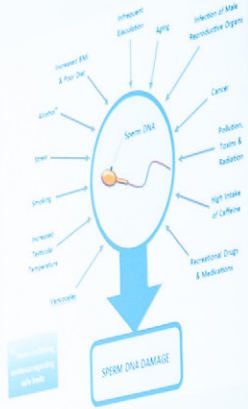


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Reactive Oxygen Species ROS

- High ROS concentrations: associated with DNA fragmentation and poor chromatin packing
- Sperm DNA damage by ROS may lead to apoptosis and resulting low sperm counts characteristic of idiopathic male factor infertility
- Sperm DNA damage by ROS also may: reduce implantation, impair embryonic development, and increase miscarriage
